

I am an interdisciplinary, community-based creative producer and socially engaged artist from Oban, with over fifteen years' experience working in a range of diverse settings, both in the Central Belt and in the Highlands and Islands. I work with professional and non-professional artists, creating inclusive and supported spaces where people from all walks of life can explore and express their creativity. My work often has strong links to place and social history, and aims to foster a sense of empowerment, identity, and interpersonal connection.

An ongoing project with Mull-based community artist Alice Stillman exploring participation and power dynamics between people of Gaelic heritage and newer residents on Mull.
MA final project, working with community participants in Oban to explore what constitutes Gaelic identity in a community experiencing language loss.
Arts project responding to local links with the 90th anniversary of the St. Kildan evacuation, by community and professional artists from Oban and Morvern.
Community-run open mic night which I initiated and support in Oban, providing space for local writers and musicians to share original work.
Inclusive, participant-led monthly singing for wellbeing, event which I initiated and conduct.
Inclusive, participant-led camera club focussing on the creative side of photography, rather than the technical.
An exhibition I produced for talc. featuring work by young, emerging Argyll artists and community artists in Oban.
A festival I produced with Architecture and Design Scotland, devising a fringe programme for meaningful community engagement with national exhibitions.
